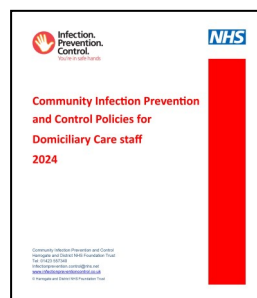
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Community Infection Prevention and Control Policies for Domiciliary Care Staff

Objective: We have produced a range of Policies for adoption which have been developed to help you with CQC requirements and achieve compliance with the *Code of practice*. All Policies contain national guidance and evidence-based practice.

Overview: Available to download free of charge or to purchase. A set of 24 Infection Prevention and Control Policies including:

1. Antimicrobial stewardship
2. BBVs (Blood-borne viruses)
3. *C. difficile* (*Clostridioides difficile*)
4. Enteral tube feeding
5. Hand hygiene
6. Isolation
7. MRGNB, including CPE (Multi-resistant Gram-negative bacteria, including carbapenemase-producing Enterobacterales)
8. MRSA (Meticillin resistant *Staphylococcus aureus*)
9. Outbreaks of communicable infection
10. Patient placement and assessment for infection risk
11. PPE (Personal protective equipment)
12. Respiratory and cough hygiene
13. Respiratory illnesses
14. Safe disposal of waste, including sharps
15. Safe management of blood and body fluid spillages
16. Safe management of care equipment
17. Safe management of linen, including uniforms and workwear
18. Safe management of sharps and inoculation injuries
19. Safe management of the care environment
20. Scabies
21. Specimen collection
22. SICPs and TBP (Standard infection control precautions and Transmission based precautions)
23. Urinary catheter care
24. Viral gastroenteritis/Norovirus

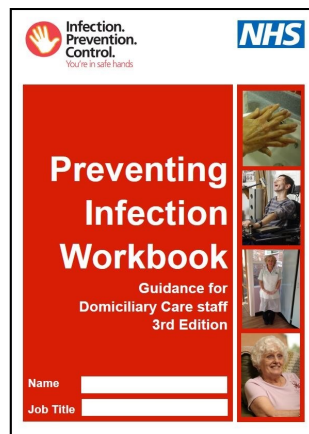
Preventing Infection Workbook: Guidance for Domiciliary Care staff 3rd Edition

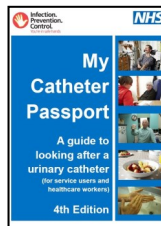
- National guidance

Audit Tools, Posters, Factsheets and Leaflets



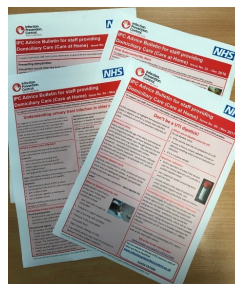
