Preparing for the winter season

The winter season results in an increased pressure across health and social care settings with more respiratory illnesses, such as flu and COVID-19, and an increase in Norovirus outbreaks. These can affect both residents and staff which result in staff shortages at a time when work load is high. The following steps can help you and your staff be more prepared to manage outbreaks of infection within your care setting.



- Encourage staff and resident vaccination uptake.
- ✓ Check your IPC policies and ensure all staff are aware of what to do in the event of an outbreak of infection.
- ✓ Do refresher training on hand hygiene and putting on and removing personal protective equipment.
- ✓ Display respiratory and cough hygiene posters, e.g. 'Catch it, Bin it, Kill it' and 'Respiratory and cough hygiene', available to download at www.infectionpreventioncontrol.co.uk.
- Encourage residents to wash their hands especially before meal times.
- ✓ Identify infections early and isolate the affected residents after undertaking an individual risk assessment.
- Report suspected outbreaks to your local Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) or UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) Team.
- Provide information for safer visiting during outbreaks.
