Preparing for the winter season

The winter season results in an increased pressure across all health and social care settings with more respiratory illnesses, such as flu and COVID-19, and an increase in diarrhoea and vomiting, e.g. Norovirus. These can affect both service users and staff which result in staff shortages at a time when work load is high. The following steps can help you be more prepared to manage the increase of infection during the winter season.

- Encourage vaccination uptake by staff and service users.
- Check your infection prevention and control policies are up-to-date and followed by staff.
- Do refresher training on hand hygiene and putting on and removing personal protective equipment.
 Remember gloves are not a substitute for hand hygiene.
- Educate/encourage service users to perform good hand hygiene.
